An agricultural — dairy herdsperson maintains the health, nutrition, and breeding of milk cows; works with milk processing and sterilizing equipment; operates and maintains barn mechanical and electrical systems and farm mechanical equipment and performs milking, feeding, watering, herd health procedures and routine herd maintenance.
