A cabinet maker builds, repairs, finishes and installs residential and commercial cabinets, wooden furniture and architectural millwork using a variety of woods, laminates and other products, reads drawings and specifications, and prepares layouts and sets up and operates woodworking equipment, both power and computerized, to machine wood products and composite materials.
