A gemsetter/goldsmith fabricates and repairs precious and semi-precious jewellery and gemstone work, tests metals, rolls and draws metals, forms rings, drills holes and sockets for stones or hinges, solders pieces of jewellery and gemstone work, designs and sets gem settings, fabricates and assembles all types of jewellery and gemstone work and cleans and polishes jewellery and gemstone work.

Are you interested in mastering different soldering, setting, repairing, and altering techniques? Do you have good vision, with or without glasses? Do you have steady hands?
