A horse harness maker stitches leather by hand, cuts heavy leather by hand, assembles and constructs material by hand, diagnoses and repairs broken or defective components and replaces worn parts, trims, slicks, rubs, creases, punches holes, bevels edges and dyes or burnishes edges and reads and interprets job specifications technical drawings.
