# Precast Concrete Erector

A precast concrete erector loads precast units on site; conducts pre-erection surveys; unloads and stores precast units; installs and aligns precast units; installs bolted and dowelled precast connections and makes welded precast connections.

- Non-compulsory trade
- 4,800 hours on the job + 600 hours of in-school training (levels 1, 2)
- Total of 5,400 hours (approximately three years)
- No certifying exam
