

Restoration Mason

A restoration mason prepares mortars; cuts out and fills joints; repairs or resets bricks, stone and terra cotta blocks in ashlar, rubble and brickwork; drills, grouts and pins fractured stones; resets copings and carries out washing and mechanical or chemical cleaning.
